Ladder Inspection Report Example [Retain for future reference.]

The following Ladder Inspection Report is one example of a document that can be used to continuously monitor the serviceability of your ladder. EGA Products strongly suggests the use of a report such as this to help prevent any potentially avoidable accidents.

LADDER INSPECTION REPORT

- Check all welds for hairline cracks
- Check all tubing for dents or bends
- Check all steps for dents or bends
- Check casters for function
- Check legs for straightness
- Check to see if all rubber feet are in place on legs
- Are all bottom cross tubes in place and secure?
- Are bottom cross tubes straight?
- Are back diagonal braces in place and secure?
- Are back diagonal braces straight?
- Is top cross tube (at top of handrail, in back) in place and secure?
- Are all set-screws and nuts and bolts in place and tight?
- Are safety labels in place?

For Ladders with Spring Loaded Casters:

- Is ladder elevated above floor by springs when unmanned?
- Does ladder rest on ladder legs when weight is placed on ladder?

For Ladders with Bottom Step Lock:

- Does bottom step-lock lift ladder up to roll?
- Does bottom step-lock release ladder down on ladder legs?

*This list may not be all inclusive. Are there any other problems or concerns that you have?
